

PERSISTENT ORGANIC POLLUTANTS (POPs) DECLARATION

The Stockholm Convention on Persistent Organic Pollutants (POPs) was adopted on May 22, 2001 in Stockholm, Sweden and the convention entered the directive into force on May 17, 2004. This global treaty was created to protect human health and the environment from chemicals that remain intact and persistent in the environment as well as in human and animal life for long periods of time.

COTSWORKS, INC. declares that there are no persistent organic pollutants (POPs) in the components/parts of the products it manufactures for its customers. To the best of our knowledge, all our parts are in compliance with the POPs Regulation and do not contain substances subject to the prohibitions listed in Annex I to Regulation (EU) 2019/1021 and amended 2020/784/EU. COTSWORKS does not use POPs in either the materials we purchase nor in our manufacturing processes.

We will continue with our due diligence when purchasing products to be sure we are up to date on any revised regulations so that our products stay in compliance with this directive.
